### 2008 South Australia Shiraz

South Australia is the country's most diverse wine region. The region's climates, topography and soil compositions allow winemaker Brian Walsh to produce a fresh, fruit-driven Shiraz, Australia's quintessential wine.

Wine Spots South Australia Shiraz offers aromas of wild berry and mulberries with hints of spice. The medium bodied palate offers generous amounts of red berry flavors and supple tannins, with hints of Viognier adding richness and texture.

### 2007 Colchagua Valley Red Wine

Colchagua Valley, located in the heart of Chile, offers exceptional soils and a Mediterranean climate that allows grapes to ripen slowly, leading to complex flavors and aromas. Wine Spots worked with winemaker Alejandro Jofre to craft a "Super Chilean" blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Carmenère, Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot.

Wine Spots Colchagua Valley Red Wine offers a richness that captures the diversity of the region and the sustainably farmed vineyard's proximity to the Andes foothills and Pacific Ocean. Aged in French oak for 8 months, the wine offers elegant tannins and a structured body with red fruits, hints of tobacco and dark chocolate.

### 2008 Bordeaux Red Wine

Bordeaux, one of the most famous wine regions in the world, is acclaimed for its terroir, which plays a vital role in wine production. Ideal soil structure and an oceanic climate combine to create an excellent environment for growing vines, further influenced by two rivers that subdivide the region. Soils of clay and chalk allow Château Sainte-Marie winemaker Stéphane Dupuch to craft a generous, powerful wine.

Wine Spots Bordeaux Red Wine offers aromas of red fruit with hints of spice. The wine has nice structure in the mouth with ripe red berry, dark cherry and subtle spice notes that linger in the finish. French oak aging adds complexity and depth.
